## **Kaleidoscope Class**

Just about all of us have set out to read the Bible from cover to cover, some of us many times, but it is a rather daunting task. It is not just one book, but many, written over thousands of years. These books, especially in the Old Testament, were organized largely by type, and are not in chronological sequence. Some of the subject matter is pretty dull and boring, like all the ancient dietary restrictions and lengthy genealogies. What is most important about the Bible as a whole is the central story of God's creation, redemption, and His relationship to His people. Fortunately, we now have available to us "The Story", sort of a "Reader's Digest" version of the Bible that uses text taken from the New International Version of the Bible, which is very readable, and rearranges it chronologically. The material not essential to understanding God's work with His people through history has been left out, and connecting text has been inserted to make "The Story" a very readable narrative. The Kaleidoscope adult Sunday School class, which meets in

room 006 downstairs in the church, will be starting to study “The Story” at 9:00 a.m. Not sure just how long it will take to go through this study, but we are hoping to do two chapters per week, which would take about 15 weeks. Books are available in the church office.
